Full-time Forensic Anthropologist

Job Location: Office of the Chief Medical Examiner—one position to office in Oklahoma City and Tulsa.

Beginning salary: Varies upon professional degree and experience. Posting open until filled.

Education and Experience: The successful candidate will have a minimum of a master's degree in anthropology; Medical Examiner knowledge or background; and have an understanding of anthropological and forensic principles, procedures and techniques.

Duties and Responsibilities: Prepare remains for evaluation; provide reports on biological indicators, trauma determination and/or toolmark evaluation; complete radiographs and assist with comparisons for identification; work with dental, fingerprint and DNA experts for identification purposes; aid investigators in the search and archaeological recovery of remains; enter and manage cases in NamUs; collect and submit DNA from unidentified persons; contact families of missing persons to collect antemortem data or familial DNA; complete fingerprinting of decedents and submit to appropriate agencies; review all potential matches for unidentified persons; communicate with law enforcement and legal representatives; provided testimony in appropriate cases; and provide instruction of interns and Fellows.

Special Requirements: Membership in AAFS. Employees must possess and maintain physical and mental stamina to perform the work, willingness to accept the physical and mental discomforts inherent in the work, and pass a rigid character and background investigation.
