RESPONSIBILITIES

- Investigate death scenes within the NC OCME catchment area, consisting of 32 counties in the central region of North Carolina.
- Confirm decedent identifications
- Perform cursory external examinations
- Conduct relevant interviews, and complete appropriate reports to assist NC OCME pathologists in accurately determining the cause and manner of death.
- Other duties as assigned.

QUALIFICATIONS

- Bachelor's degree in a biological or medically-related field, forensic science, or criminal justice Required
- Minimum one years of experience in an investigatory (homicide/death scene investigations) or response field (military, law enforcement, Emergency Medical Technician Paramedic).
- American Board of Medicolegal Death Investigators (ABMDI) certification is preferred.
